HINTS AND ETIQUETTE

Bowls is a friendly game. Let the exercise of consideration for others, courtesy and good sportsmanship add charm to a skillful and rewarding sport. Here are a few tips that may help:

HINTS FOR BEGINNERS (and others)

- 1. Bowls should not be dropped on the Green.
- 2. Do not stand on the edges of the Green.
- 3. Matches, Cigarette Ends, etc., should be placed in the litter baskets, NOT IN THE DITCHES. Do not smoke on or near the greens.
- 4. Bowls should not be moved until the shot has been decided.
- 5. After delivering a bowl, a player should retire at least two metres behind the mat.
- 6. Don't delay the game.
- 7. Don't wander around or move about the head when a player is about to deliver a bowl, and particularly do not stand in line with the boundary pegs.
- 8. Don't talk in a loud tone whilst a player is about to deliver a bowl.
- 9. When watching a match always observe strict neutrality. Advice or criticism must not be given. Barracking against an opponent's bowl is bad form.
- 10. All Bowlers should know and understand the Laws of the Game as laid down by the Australian Women's & Bowls Australia.

"DO"

- 1. Give full support to the members of your team and Skipper.
- 2. Advise your opponent if unable to keep an appointment for any game.
- 3. Always conform to the correct attire for play.
- 4. Applaud good shots and generally encourage all players.
- 5. Keep still and silent whilst your opponent and other members of the team are playing.
- 6. Always watch the play. Take an interest without interferin g.
- 7. Avoid moving around behind the mat.
- 8. Play always for the side and not individual success.
- 9. Drink water before and during a match to avoid dehydration

"DON'T"

- 1. Argue with the Skipper on the shot to play.
- 2. Unless asked, offer comment to the Skipper what to do.
- 3. Develop mannerisms that indicate displeasure at indifferent play or success.
- 4. Follow the bowl further than the rules allow or stray on the adjoining rink.
- 5. Have excuses for bad play and readily accept praise for success.
- 6. Dispute the Umpire's decision.
- 7. Give advice to players from the bank.
- 8. Abuse the privileges of the Club.
