Summary of Annual General Meeting

An Annual General Meeting of the Club was held on Saturday 22 June 2024 at 11.00am. There were 16 members in attendance. There was a minute silence held for our deceased members and their families which included Gary Pincini.

Greg Laws acted as chairperson of meeting in absence of the president, James MacPhee. The Minutes from the previous meeting were read and agreed and there were no issues requiring any further discussion.

Greg gave a summary of activities for 2003/2004 period which included:

- Acknowledgement of the work of president and committee members
- Summary of Zone achievements of our bowlers
- Summary of our Platinum League participation
- Agreement by Club to transfer assets and liabilities from Zone 10 to Metro NorthWest Region by way of vote by the Members

Phillip Roy, Chairman of Selectors, gave summary of our pennant season and thanked those bowlers who regularly supported our teams including our lady bowlers.

4. And arising from the meeting nominations were received and accepted for Greg Laws as president, Phillip Roy as vice president, Ian Cummerford as committee member and John Uren as committee member.

As there were no multiple nominations for any position, voting was not required by the members. The position of Chairman of Selectors will be

discussed with the new committee when the Bowling Coordinator is appointed by management.

The Chairman requested if there were any questions from the floor with:

1. Barry Goldsworthy requesting that the committee investigate the current cost of social bowling at our club compared to that of our neighbouring clubs and submit a paper to the Board on the members' behalf.

2. Phillip Roy suggested that proceeds from Wrong Bias Box continue to be donated to Allowah Children's Hospital which was agreed by the Members.

3. Dave Gleeson thanked the outgoing and new committees and advised that the club would pay the entry fees for any Region competitions but social and club competitions would need to be paid for by the participants, a one-off \$10 entry fee for club championships.
